INTRODUCTION


Anlicipation mounts on the night of a mikvah visit. An entire week of countdown and preparation comes to a head. The night has arrived.

Intimacy. The relationship of husband and wife is most private and exalted in Judaism, touching upon the most sacred and innermost sensitivities of the partners.

Confidentiality is paramount in the mikvah experience. Only you and your husband know your mikvah date. At the mikvah, the attendant alone will greet you at the door when you come, and show you to your luxurious preparation room with spa-like amenities.

It is in our bedrooms that we build the most hallowed of all hallowed shrines. Immersion in the mikvah is the gateway to the holy ground of conjugality.

A woman's monthly immersion in a mikvah is the cornerstone of the marital relationship connecting wife and husband. Preparation includes a personal seven day countdown, culminating in *tevilah* (immersion in a mikvah) after nightfall on the seventh night.



Approach the doors of the mikvah, and access a unique synchrony of spiritual and physical. Experience the oneness of soul and body in the warm, serene setting of the mikvah. Open the door and enter your mikvah experience.

Upon immersion, a blessing is said, and personal prayers may be added.
